BEEHIVE INFORMATION

There are two beehives at Landmark made from Canadian red western cedar manufactured in Lincolnshire, United Kingdom. The beehives are located on the roof, which stands at 14 floors.

BEEES

Each hive will contain approximately 80,000 worker bees during the summer period. Inside the hive will be three types of bees: a single queen bee, female worker bees and hundreds of male drones during the summer.

The bees are bred and nurtured on a honey farm in Wales. When they make their move to Manchester at the end of April/early May 2021, they will be fully formed colonies that are ready to grow and thrive.

HONEY

Honey will be harvested on site into 340g jars. The jars will be branded with a unique Landmark Honey logo, and sold via the onsite ground floor Change Please coffee shop to occupiers and the general public. The honey will be featured on Landmark's Occupier Portal along with weekly updates of the bees.

Each hive will produce approximately 50-80 jars based in the City Centre. This does depend on the weather during the summer. Any honey collected in the first year is seen as a bonus as the bees usually need a year to establish the colonies.

OCCUPIER INVOLVEMENT
